



Used Books



8th Grade

In Science, students are still working on our Chemistry unit. We will be learning about the discovery of the atom and how it has changed over the years. Students will learn about the atomic structure. In addition to that, students will learn the systematic organization of the periodic table. After the chemistry unit is complete, we will learn about the basic principles of heredity during our Reproduction and Heredity unit.

In Language Arts, we have started two major endeavors that will take us all the way through 3rd quarter. The students have just begun working on their poetry unit. They will be required to learn multiple types of figurative language, write 10 different types of poems, and put it all together in a book that they create. In addition to that, each student has been assigned a book that they must read on their own at home. Every Friday, they meet with the students who have the same book and discuss what they have read. It looks to be a very busy and productive quarter!



In Social Studies, students will be learning about the Cold War and Civil Rights in the upcoming weeks.

In 8th Grade Math, we are finishing up Chapter 6 on angles, polygons and transformations. Next week, we will be starting Chapter 7 on finding area and volume of 2D and 3D figures.

In Algebra 1-2 Honors, we are finishing our unit 9 on solving systems of equations and inequalities and working towards moving into high degree polynomials

Nurse <u>Immunization rules for students</u> 11 YEARS OF AGE AND OLDER

Students $\underline{\mathbf{11}}$ years of age and older and entering $\mathbf{6}^{th}$ grade are now required to have $\underline{\mathbf{7dap}}$ and $\underline{\mathbf{MV}}$ to attend school beginning next school year 2011-2012. These immunizations are **recommended** for students in $\mathbf{5}^{th}$ grade as they turn $\mathbf{11}$ years old.

- **Tdap** (tetanus, diphtheria, attenuated pertussis) required for students as they turn 11 years old and older if 5 years have passed since the last tetanus/diphtheria vaccine dose (DTP, DTaP, or Td).
- MV (meningococcal vaccine) Meningococcal meningitis can be highly contagious in teens and young adults and
 may result in severe disability or death.

**Students who will be 11 years old and entering 6th grade by 15 August 2011 must have documentation of these immunizations PRIOR to beginning school year in August, 2011. Your child may be exempted from school until these shots are obtained.

DO NOT WAIT UNTIL AUGUST TO GET THEM!

Exemptions to immunization requirements for religious, personal, or medical reasons are available.

Please contact the School Nurse for information and forms.

Immunizations are available thru your primary care provider, Walgreen's Take Care Clinics, CVS Pharmacy Minute Clinics, or you may go to the Maricopa County Community Clinic, located on the NE corner of 67th and Peoria Ave. and get them for free.

Please bring/send proof of immunization to me as soon as possible. Information may also be mailed or faxed to the number and/or address below. Thank you for your attention to this new immunization rule by Arizona to protect our children from preventable illnesses.
